A student graduating with a B.A. in Literature from Wilberforce University will be able to:

- Engage with the writings of diverse cultures, literary genres, periods, and technologies of writing through the critical approach to the major authors and works of British, American, African American, and World Literatures; and demonstrate an appreciation of the nature and historical evolution of the English language.
- Demonstrate career readiness skills necessary to smoothly and effectively transition into an entry level position or graduate program in or related to Literature.
